

But how is it possible to focus attention on ourselves, on our mission and on the social impact of our activit ies, when the pandemic has been eroding the economic reserves of the assocations, making the social fabric even more fragile? The answer is unambiguous: both a social and an economic balance must be found. The accounts, of course, but not only them. Because, on the one hand, it is necessary to ensure that our organization continues to provide services in a short term, thanks to actions to preserve liquidity, cut expenses, defer payment of dues or through access to emergency funds from presenting service programmes worthy of the attention of LCIF or the various district foundations operating in some of the 17 districts of Multiple District Italy.

On the other hand, however, Lions Clubs International must be subjected to a complete x-ray, undergoing through a healthy dose of self-criticism: from rethinking one's identity to relocating one's mission, from exploring innovative collaboration strategies to identifying yesterday's priorities, today no longer in step with the post-Covid times. In short, we need to have the courage to change a few deep-rooted convictions, as for example the one that it is more convenient to do small services rather than concentrating all our resources on global services resulting from well-organized teamwork! Aiming at a single far-reaching goal that involves an entire District, an area or a constituency in the participation where the protagonism of the individual leaves room to a collective interpretation of the concrete we serve, we must always remember that the policy of "WE" is the true strength of an Association like ours that operates on an international scale.

## **LIONS ACTIVITIES AFTER COVID-19**

In these days when the Coronavirus has been hitting the world, our Association was on the front line to give answers to the new, pressing needs imposed by the contagion. From the door-to-door delivery of food and medicines to vulnerable people, to the rapid online conversion of services, to the networking of cultural initiatives in streaming: the spurt of solidarity has kept pace with a galloping contagion from north to south of the peninsula. Yet, if the reaction phase to the pandemic emergency can be considered "mission accomplished", new challenges are on the horizon for volunteering.

In order to survive and re-emerge in a radically transformed world, the non-profit organizations will have to undertake a decision-making marathon that will accompany them, as a first stage, to a full recovery from the effects of the pandemic and, as a second one, to enter the new post-coronavirus reality. In this steep path, paved with obstacles but also with opportunities to be seized, the compass that will guide the association needs to be its ability to look itself in the mirror, to take stock of its activities by re-evaluating the mission, the objectives, the strategies and the social impact, e.g. recalibrating its own models of economic sustainability.

That's a pretty tall order" or t is going to be difficult, people say, since it requires a constant medium and long term look almost impossible to conceive when volunteering is assailed by daily unforeseen events, urgent request to be met, financial needs to cope immediately with. Without forgetting the uncertainty of the future. However, this undertaking is not oly possible but vital to the survival of our Lions Clubs. Thus, if rolling up one's sleeves was the first commandment of solidarity during the peak of the pandemic, reinventing oneself is going to be the watchword of post-isolation. This combination, a balanced blend of "doing" and "thinking" a new architecture of local realities, will be the necessary key for the non-profit world to get access to the future.

## Lion Susan Galea Borg writes:

On Wednesday 16th June following the Sliema Lions Club zoom meeting, we were very privileged and grateful to be given a talk by Historian, Academic, and Author Professor Henry Joseph Frendo. The talk was on his "Diaspora, Maltese Overseas Settlement" published by Midsea books. Prof. Henry explores the migratory experience of the Maltese from the 1920s to the 1940s focusing mainly on culture and politics.

Recurring themes of concern are the retention and also loss of cultural identity in the countries were they settled. Maltese and Gozitans have migrated to practically all the countries in the world in search of a new life. The engaging and photographed personal experiences of Henry and his family were shared with us. His investigation of records of Maltese settlers in his life journey travelling and living abroad is fascinating. We are very fortunate to have had this stunning overview of the Maltese presence in the world and for being granted the opportunity to record the talk for future reference.
