Dr. Patti Hill is a Canadian psychologist and educator wo was elected as International President of Lions Clubs International at the associaation's 105<sup>th</sup> International Covention held in Boston USA in July 2023. She was elected as First Vice President at the 104<sup>th</sup> International Convention in June 2022. She has been a Lion for more than 32 years and her life and career have been defined by her passion for social justice, her dedication to helping others reach their full potential and her devotion

to making the world a better place for all people.

At her inaugural speech President Patti Hill stated that "CHANGING THE WORLD" is the motto chosen for her Presidential Year. The President stated It is a journey. There is no middle and no end. There is only a beginning which starts with us (Lions). It happened through the many small choices and acts of kindness we make every day. #### WHO WAS MELVIN JONES

Many a time at Club meetings the name Melvin Jones is mentioned. Hence it is worth knowing who was Melvin Jones, the Founder of Lions Clubs International.

Melvin Jones was born on January 13, 1879 in Fort Thomas, Arizona, the son of a United States Army captain who commanded a troop of scouts. Later his father was transferred and the family moved east. As a young man, Melvin Jones made his home In Chicago, Illinois, and became associated with an insurance firm. In 1913 he formed his own agency.



Jones soon joined the Business Circle, a businessmen's luncheon group, soon being elected Secretary. This group was one of many at that time devoted solely to promote the financial interests of their membership. Because of the limited appeal, they were destined to disappear. Melvin Jones, then a 38year-old Chicago business leader had other plans.

Melvin Jones stated "What if these men who are successful because of their drive, intelligence and ambition, were to put their talents to work improving their communities"? Thus, at his invitation, delegates from men's club met in Chicago to lay the groundwork for such an organisation and on June 7 1917. Lions Clubs International was born.

Melvin Jones eventually abandoned his Insurance Agency to devote himself full time to Lions at International Headquarters in Chicago. It was under his dynamic leadership that Lions Clubs earned the prestige necessary to attract civil-minded members.

The Association's founder was also recognised as a leader by those outside the Association. One of his greatest honours was in 1945 when he represented Lions Clubs International as a consultant in San Francisco at the organisation of the United Nations.

Melvin Jones, the man whose personal code: *"You can't get very far until you start doing something else"* became a guiding principle for public-minded people the world over died June 1, 1961 aged 82,

### THINGS TO KNOW AND REMEMBER

ORIGIN OF NAME "LIONS". On June 17, 1917 at the invitation of Melvin Jones, delegates met in Chicago. The only point of contention was the selection of a name for the new organisation. Melvin Jones researched the idea of calling the new organisation LIONS. The name Lions was chosen on a secret ballot over several others because the lion stood for strength, courage, fidelity and vital actions. The official name of the Association is "The International Association of Lions Clubs" or simply "Lions Clubs International".



LOGO: The Lions emblem or logo is a recognised and respected symbol around the world. Although it has been modified and modernised, the basic design dates back to 1919. It consists of a gold "L" on a blue field surrounded by a gold circle. On either side of the circle is the profile of a Lion's head, one looking back upon a proud past and the other looking optimistically toward the future.

WHO ARE THE LIONS. Lions are men and women dedicated to serving those in need, in our own community and around the world. The 1.42 million members in more than 46000 Clubs in over 207 countries are different in many ways, but share a core belief – community is what we make it. In addition to humanitarian service, Lions enjoy fellowship and develop leadership skills.
